



Dear Crossroads Family,

At Crossroads, we want to care for our congregation in all respects, including the physical well-being of our community. To that end, we are asking you, our C-Fam, to take precautions to keep yourself and others safe, especially in light of recent developments with the Coronavirus (COVID-19).

Currently, officials are not recommending the cancellation of public events or Sunday church gatherings. Crossroads will remain open, and we will continue to have services on Sundays and mid-week programming. If local and state health officials do recommend closure, or we determine it is in the best interest of our Crossroads family to close, we will inform everyone to the best of our abilities through our website, emails, texts, and social media.

During this time, here's how we are committed to keeping our campus clean:

- ◆ We will sanitize frequently touched surfaces such as doors, handles, tables, check-in stations, and sinks.
- ◆ Our staff and volunteer teams will wash their hands frequently and stay home if they are sick. Our café team will wear gloves when preparing coffee.
- ◆ We will provide additional hand sanitizer stations around campus for everyone to use.
- ◆ Offering buckets will be relocated to the back of the Worship Center, so you don't need to pass them down the row. Remember, you can also give online.

In addition to keeping our campus clean, we will be taking extra care of our kids' spaces. Crossroads Kids volunteers will sanitize surfaces, toys, and frequently used items between services.

During this time, we are asking you to help stop the spread of the virus in the following ways:

- ◆ Stay at home when you or a family member are sick.
- ◆ Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially after going to the bathroom, before eating and after blowing your nose, coughing, or sneezing.
- ◆ Cover your sneeze or cough with a tissue or your arm.
- ◆ Get in the habit of NOT touching your face so often.
- ◆ Substitute shaking hands at church with a wave or a friendly smile.
- ◆ If you or someone you know tests positive for COVID-19, please let us know so we can find a way to help, pray for everyone involved, and take any necessary precautions here at Crossroads.

If you or a family member are sick or need to stay home during this time, you are welcome to watch each Sunday's sermon on our Youtube channel. You can also catch the audio podcast of each message on our website.
